

About The Types of Catholic Wedding Ceremonies

There are two forms of our Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding or Nuptial Mass:

Often referred to as a "full Mass," it is the celebration of the Mass with the wedding ceremony inserted in the middle of the Liturgy. It presupposes both parties are practicing Catholics and receiving Holy Communion after a proper spiritual preparation.

The Wedding Ceremony:

This has all the elements of the above (music, readings, vows, etc.) but without the celebration of Mass. This form is suitable for general congregations and is of shorter duration than the above.

PLEASE NOTE: Nuptial Masses are NOT celebrated on Sundays. The ONLY exception is when a visiting priest is invited by the family, approved by the Pastor and is willing to offer a Nuptial Mass on Sunday.

From Lastor's

Dear Friends,

Palm Sunday has, I may say so, a liturgical "Split Personality": on the one hand a brief triumph in the Entrance of Our Lord that begins the Palm Sunday Liturgy, followed by the rest of the Mass in which Good Friday and the Passion are the focus.

This year, of course, we will not be able to personally share in the ceremonies of Palm Sunday and Holy Week. However, the message remains as ever.

Triumph and Tragedy might be an easy caption, but not the actual truth.

It is the Triumph of Divine Love through the seeming "tragedy" of the Cross.

Preaching on the Passion of Christ, St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1090-1153) pointed to a large Crucifix and asked his hearers *Who did this?* He paused, and asked again more insistently *WHO DID THIS?* After a further pause he gave the answer: *Love did this, heedless of His dignity!*

Love is a powerful thing. The Scriptures tell us it is as stern as death, relentless as the netherworld. It is so powerful and complex that the Greeks used three words for it: Eros (physical passion and desire); Philia (friendship and loyalty); and Agape (a profound unselfish desire for the true good of the other, undefeated and undaunted in its desire to go good to the Other). It is this latter word that we find used in the New Testament to describe Christ's love for us. When Saint Jerome translated the Greek texts into the common Latin of the 4th century he used the word Caritas rather than the more common Amor. Over the centuries that was rendered into English as "charity" which has become for many a somewhat impersonal word redolent of organized "charities". We tend to use the single word "love" for what the Gospel and Saint Paul meant by agape or caritas.

Odd that our English tongue, so rich and varied in so many ways, has but one word for that *many-splendored thing*. There are all kinds of love. There is even a love to BE loved.

It was Love that did the "this" of the Passion and Death of Christ on the Cross. It was His love for us; NOT His desire to BE loved by us that drove Him to the foreseen Cross.

If Jesus desired "to be loved" first and foremost, He would have betrayed His Father's will. His human nature recoiled in horror at the prospect of the Passion and all its horrific features; but He would not renounce the proffered *cup* in Gethsemane if it meant abandoning His very purpose.

He would have *come down from that cross*, as He was taunted to do, if He wanted to BE loved.

No, He loves us too much to merely please us.

We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee. For by Thy Holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world!

Dear Friends,

The following directives were received Monday, March 16th. Like you, I find this an occasion of regret and sorrow.

Bound by the obligation of ecclesial obedience and concern for the public health, I have implemented them immediately. The communication to the priests from the Diocese explicitly cancels all public Liturgies and devotions until Easter Tuesday, April 14th.

As you can imagine, this is an unprecedented and disturbing time. I will try to keep you informed by the parish website <u>smrcc.org</u> and the electronic bulletin on the website as to any further developments and changes.

As of Mar h 17th as well, all scheduled Confessions are suspended and no Funeral Liturgies are to be celebrated in church or in the Funeral Home.

The church will remain open for private prayer and visits to the Blessed Sacrament.

Now more than ever, you are all in my daily Divine Office and prayers!

As of March 15, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control announced that it is recommended that all events involving 50 people or more be suspended or postponed.

In an effort to promote health and safety of all people, the Diocese of Rockville Centre announces the following measures:

- 1. Beginning Monday, March 16, 2020 at 3:00 PM, all Masses (weekday and weekend), meetings, and non-essential activities in our parishes are suspended or postponed through Tuesday, April 14, 2020. This will include all Holy Week and Easter Liturgies. However, these will be televised and available online (see below). This includes all Confirmations, First Communions, First Confessions, etc. When these events are rescheduled, they will be announced by local parishes. Baptisms should be postponed unless absolutely necessary and should observe the limits.
- 2. Churches may remain open for private prayer at the discretion of the Pastor. However, they must observe the recommendation of fewer than 50 people permitted.

3.` The Catholic Faith Network (CFN) will provide televised and online daily Masses, ''including Holy Week and Easter Liturgies, as well as other devotional and spiritual programs. (Optimum channel 29/137, Verizon FiOS TV channel 296, and Spectrum channel 162/471.) CFN is also available on selected cable and satellite systems and through 24/7 live stream at CFNtv.org. You can also watch CFN on Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Android, or by downloading the CFN iOS mobile app at the app store by searching "Catholic Faith Network" or "CFN."

Currently, our Catholic Schools are closed through March 27, 2020, following the measures taken by Nassau and Suffolk public schools. However, we continue to monitor the situation and will adapt and update as needed. Again, we continue to monitor the situation and will adapt and update as needed.

In an effort to participate in the statewide efforts to halt the spread of the COVID-19 virus, effective on Wednesday, March 18, 2020, the administrative offices of the Diocese of Rockville Centre located in Rockville Centre and Massapequa Park will be closed through Monday, April 13, 2020. Offices are scheduled to reopen on Tuesday, April 14, 2020, at 8:30 am. These locations will be thoroughly cleaned during closure. All employees will be working remotely, with business being conducted by email, telephonically or electronically, as best as possible.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE Cancelled due to COVID 19 coronavirus

It's with a heavy heart that I have decided to end the public vigil portion of the spring 40 Days for Life campaign effective immediately due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

For the remainder of the campaign, we will continue the daily emails on what has happened this campaign. **During** the remaining days of the campaign, we will unite in

prayer, fasting, and spiritual union to pray for an end to abortion and this pandemic.

This was the toughest decision I've made serving as President & CEO of this lifesaving movement, but I feel it is the right one. Since we did the first campaign back in 2004, I have visited over 530 vigil locations, and the safety of your family during a campaign is and will always be my number one priority.

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
